






## an Introduction to Colossians

#### Author and Date

The epistle to the Colossians was written by the Apostle Paul in about 60-61 AD. He wrote it from Rome while he was under house arrest awaiting a decision regarding his trial for being a faithful, bold witness for the Lord Jesus Christ.

## The Church at Colosse

The city of Colosse was located about 100 miles east of Ephesus in the western part of the country that today is known as Turkey. Although Paul had never personally visited this church, he possessed a great love for them. They were mainly Gentile believers who gathered in homes for fellowship, worship, and study. Two of these homes were those of Philemon (Philemon 1:2) and Nymphas (Colossians 4:15).

# Background and Purpose of the Letter

Epaphras most likely planted the church as a result of Paul's ministry in Ephesus (54-58 AD). During these early years of the church certain false teachers came into the city spreading false doctrine. They sought to draw the church away from the truth of the Gospel. Epaphras made a trip to Rome to visit Paul in jail and brought the news of the heresies that were plaguing the church at Colosse.

These false teachers were misleading young believers with wrong ideas about Who Jesus Christ is. They over-emphasized church rituals, demanding the strict observance of Jewish ceremonies such as circumcision (2:11; 3:11) and the feasts (2:16; 21). They established rules about what kinds of foods should and shouldn't' be eaten and they promoted the worship of angels (2:18). In relying on human wisdom (2:4; 8) pagan influences, and Greek thought, they claimed to have special knowledge (2:18). Like humanists today, they denied Christ's deity and His sacrificial death on the cross for sin. These heresies which penetrated many churches in the second and third centuries became known as Gnosticism.

Paul wrote to extend his love to the church ad to remind them of the preeminence of Christ and the simplicity of the Gospel. In doing this, he diligently warned them (and us) to beware of false teachers who would seek to cause them to turn from the truth of the Scriptures. Finally, he exhorted them to holy living—to live out to the fullest extent all that Christ Jesus had done in them.

#### The SOAP bible study Method:

This method begins by reading through the section of scripture and taking time to further dig into a verse that ministers to you. After choosing a verse, you write the verse down and take time to ponder and answer the following questions:

#### S - SCRIPTURE

#### Physically write out the Bible verse

You'll be amazed at what God will reveal to you when you slow down to write or meditate on what you are reading!

#### O - OBSERVATION

## What do you see in the verses you're reading?

Who is the audience? Is there a repetition of words? What words stand out to you?

What is the main lesson or theme?

#### A - APPLICATION

## When God's Word becomes personal

What is God saying to me today? How can I apply what I just read to my life? Are there any changes I need to make?

#### P-PRAYER

## Pray God's Word back to Him

If He has revealed something to you during this time in His Word, pray about it. Confess if He has revealed some sin that is in your life. Take time to thank Him for His goodness in your life.

# More Tools for Personal Devotional Time

- Begin with Grace and Prayer!
- Read through your portion of scripture for the day until a verse or phrase catches your attention. Remember, God's Holy Spirit will use your natural curiosity to point you in the right direction. Write down the verse in your journal and think about it (meditate upon it) throughout your day/week.
- ❖ Use tools to dig into the verse you have written down. The following tools can be helpful:
  - Cross References Either from your bible or verses the LORD brings to mind. Consider writing
    one or two of these in your journal if they bring more understanding to the verse, or if the LORD
    uses another verse to minister to you.
  - Definitions Use a dictionary to define what various words mean, even if you think you know the definition.
  - If your bible does not have cross references, you can use the concordance in the back of your bible as well.
- Re-write the verse into your own words. Find scripture references to support the way you have interpreted the verse. If you are unable to support your interpretation with scripture, revisit your interpretation and see what the LORD is trying to show you.
- No matter what tool you use, consider writing in your journal a paragraph about what the LORD has shown you through the verse and/or cross references and how He has used it to minister to you. Then write a prayer sharing your heart with the LORD.
- ➤ Tools for Bible Study For when you desire to dig in further. Remember, Bible study can be used to dig in further to what the LORD has spoken to you during devotional time, but is not a replacement for devotional time.

Please use these tools carefully with discretion. Picking up your phone during devotional time to use an app can hinder your time with the Lord and distract you to other things. Commentaries can help to illuminate what the Lord has shown you. Use them once you have allowed the LORD to speak to you personally about what you are reading.
