For Personal Reflection:

Who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory."

Psalm 46:1, "God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble."

Meditate upon these truths that the LORD is our inheritance and our refuge. What do these truths mean to you?

Chapters 23 and 24


For Personal Reflection:

4.	What was Israel's response to be considering all the the LORD had done for them? (verse 14)


5.	Read Romans 12:1-2. How is the exhortation of Paul similar to that of Joshua?
